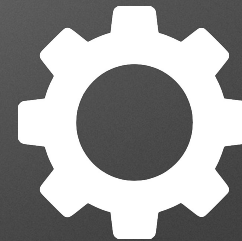

Code

- Drupal Core
- Modules
- Themes
- Dependencies
- Stored in the filesystem

Components of a Site



Content

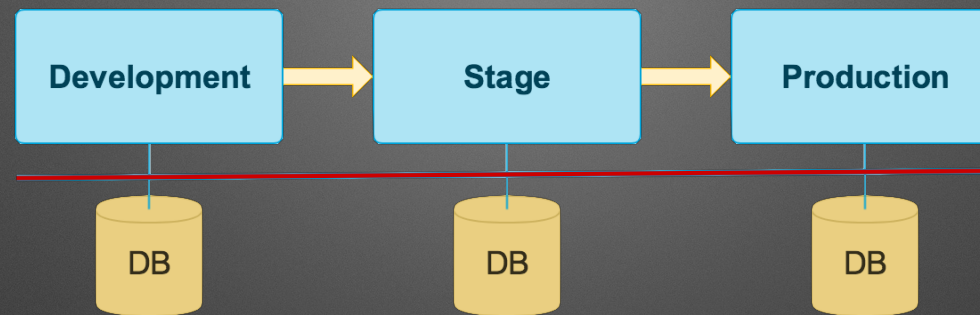
- Nodes
- Entities
- Images
- Stored in the database
- Stored in the files folder

Components of a Site



Config

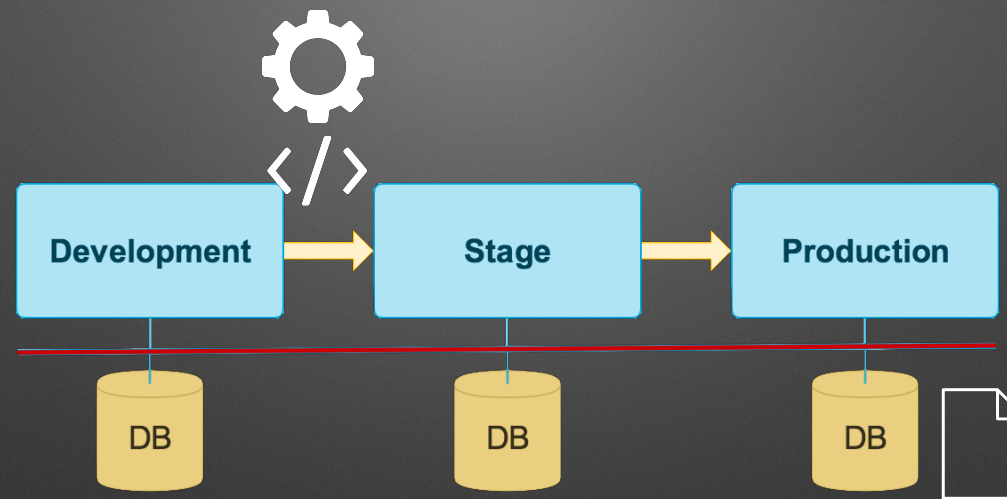
- Site Name
- Views
- Content Types
- Fields
- Stored in the database



Development Workflow

* Ask familiar with this workflow?

Ideally

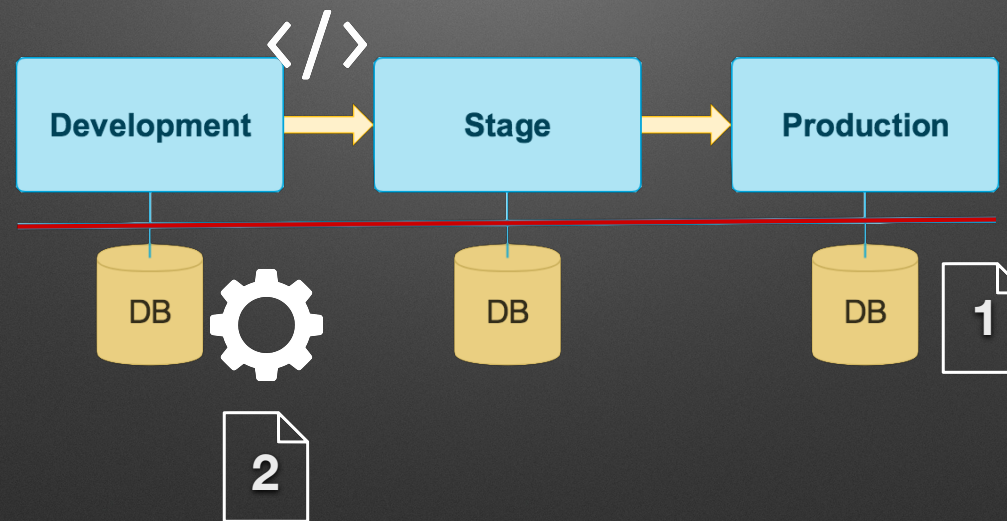


Move code and config towards production

Don't mess with content on production

Content may move from production to stage or development

Reality



- * Config is in the database! With the content
- * Notice Production has content and dev/stage have different content
- * Can't easily merge databases (they are more or less a single thing)
- * So, when you deploy the database from stage to production,
- * [CLICKs]
- * you blow away the production content and replace it with “foos” and “bars” and references to cat pictures (that may or may not be in the files directory [different story])

What is Configuration Management?

Tries to manage this by removing configuration from the database.

Export configurations into a module
Enable the module to import the configuration

Drupal 7 “Solution”: Drawbacks

- Intended to be able to copy “features” between sites, not to manage a single site configuration between environments.
- Exports sometimes picked up unintended configuration
- Not all configurations available for export

Drupal 8 “Solution”: Configuration Management

- Core has system for configuration
- Configuration can be written to .yml files and stored with the code.
- Intended to copy configuration between environments
- Not intended to share config across sites

- * With system in Core all modules are expected to use it. It is pretty easy to use too.
- * .yml files can be revisioned and stored in git
- * Configuration Management 2.0 initiative is here to help with cross-site configuration

Drupal 8

Configuration Management

- Active configuration is in the DB and managed by core's config system
- Configuration can be exported to .yaml files and stored with the code.
- Configuration can be imported from .yaml files into the Active configuration

* Config in DB is faster and easier. - Can be cached with memcache or redis, doesn't have to read thousands of files on every request

Where are config files?

- Site configuration
 - **sites/{site}/files/config{hash}/sync** -
Change this in settings.php
- Modules, Themes, Profiles
 - **config/install** - Config imported on install
 - **config/optional** - Config imported if dependencies are met

- * Site config sync with has tries to hide these files from the public
- * Change the location in settings.php to something outside of the web root

Limitations

- **Intended to copy configuration between environments**
- **Not intended to share config across sites**
- **Features still exists for its intended purpose of sharing features between sites**

- * Though there are ways around sharing between sites, like Features for D8, or installing config with a profile or developing your own modules with hook_updates
- * See some more development of this with the configuration management 2.0 initiative currently in progress

Useful Configuration Modules

- config_override_warn - If config is overridden in settings.php it will let you know if you try to change it in the UI.
- config_readonly - Adds settings.php config to lock down config changes from the UI.
- config_split - Alternate config for specific environments

- * `config_override_warn` - Thanks Dave Ried!
- * `config_readonly` - If you really don't want config to change in production
- * `config_split` - Eg. you want devel module enabled on dev, but not production. See the next presentation
